Board Chair's Report



Statewide Forum and AGM

The VMSA Statewide Forum and AGM was held on 16 October at The Meadows Conference and Events Centre in Broadmeadows. Feedback from men's shed representatives who attended has been overwhelmingly positive.

In opening, I welcomed shed representatives and read a letter of support from our newly appointed Minister Ros Spence.

Over 160 representatives from 65 sheds took part in this terrific event and heard presentations from Paul Sladdin, president of AMSA, Trevor Gorey, president of the West Australian Men's Sheds Association and David Seen, president of the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association.

John Greatrix, president of the Queensland Men's Shed Association and John Sharples, president of the NSW Men's Shed Association were both apologies. John Greatrix's farm was destroyed in the Queensland fires days earlier and we send him our best wishes.

These presentations were particularly interesting because they gave different perspectives on activities around the country in what is a strong national men's shed movement.

The day included a lively open forum where delegates could put questions to the board and each other and we also had a number of speakers including Bronwyn Halfpenny MLA for Thomastown and Emma Kealy MLA for Lowan, the co-convenors of the Victorian Parliamentary Friends of Men's Sheds and the VMSA, both strong supporters of men's sheds. There was also a range of speakers on men's health and wellbeing.

The VMSA was able to stage this event free of charge to members because of the generous support of Melbourne Greyhounds -The Meadows- and Greyhound Racing Victoria who resourced the whole day including all of the catering. We are enormously grateful for this support from both organisations.

ExxonMobil made a significant donation which enabled us to give country sheds more than 100km from Melbourne \$100 to assist with travel expenses. Making this event free is very important as we need to do everything we can to encourage sheds to attend and exchange ideas and stories with each other.

Other sponsors included Bloom Hearing, Booran Motors, AEG, Ryobi, Bendigo Bank, Kabadoodle, Dynaweld and Bunning's Trade. We extend our sincere thanks to all these organisations.

A raffle at the end of the forum saw many delegates receive fabulous prizes donated by our generous sponsors which was a great way to round off the event.

The AGM followed and progressed smoothly to unanimously approve rule changes to allow VMSA to pursue DGR status. This will enable donations to the VMSA to be tax deductible.

Two nominations were received to fill three vacant board positions and Colin Prowd who renominated and Mick Overman who nominated were both declared elected.

The Statewide Forum/AGM next year will be bigger again, so keep an eye out for the date which we will publish shortly and put it in your diaries when you get it.

In closing I wish to acknowledge the two retiring board directors, Tom Rolls and Jim Gundren and thank them for their significant contribution to the VMSA.

MOUs and AMSA Rule Changes

The important work of reunifying the men's shed movement across Australia continues.

The recent Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) between the Victorian, Western Australian, Tasmanian and Queensland men's sheds associations and the Australian Men's Shed Association (AMSA) have paved the way for rules changes to the AMSA constitution.

Importantly, these MOUs have been agreed by the boards of the four state associations and the AMSA Board and all parties are continuing to operate in good faith to progress this matter. This now requires rule changes to the AMSA constitution to give each state association the right to nominate a director to the AMSA Board.

It has been agreed that the proposed AMSA rule changes will soon be put to members at a Special General Meeting. If this passes it will give full effect to the MOUs and be a very big step towards completing the reunification of the men's shed movement across the country.

CEO's Report



As we start the homerun towards the last part of the year, I'm pleased to report that our two newly recruited field staff Jim and Nigel are settling in and have been very busy on the road visiting dozens of sheds.

After two years of on and off lockdowns in Victoria it's fantastic to have the guys out visiting sheds every week building face to face relationships with many of you, listening to your stories and experiencing the great projects you are doing in your sheds.

Our communications manager, Courtney is also busy helping sheds spread their stories via social media, so if you need help getting your shed onto Facebook, please reach out to Courtney.

Don't forget the Victorian Government Men's Shed funding round is currently open and closes on the 8th of December. We lobbied government on your behalf, and they listened increasing the maximum grant available to \$100,000 to take into account rising costs of building and renovating sheds. Don't leave your application to close to the deadline, as it gets more difficult to get quotes quickly as you get closer to Christmas.

We are currently implementing a new Shed database, and I would ask you if you haven't already to please update your shed contact details with us so we have the latest information. This can be done online on our website, or alternatively in person when our field officers visit you.

Later in this newsletter you will find information about free building materials from Superyard coming out of the Melbourne Cup carnival that are available to sheds. Thanks to Port Phillip Men's shed for alerting us to this great recycling initiative.

We are always on the lookout for stories for the newsletter from the sheds, if you have an interesting project or event going on in the shed, please let us know.

Applications are open for the Men's Shed Funding Program

Men's Shed groups can now apply for grants up to \$100,000 to help build or improve Men's Sheds across the state.

This latest grant round is part of the ongoing Men's Shed Funding Program.

Every year \$1 million is invested into supporting Victorian Men's Sheds, including around \$140,000 towards the Victorian Men's Shed Association.

The funding program supports Men's Shed groups to help build new facilities or upgrade existing ones. This may include upgrades like a dust-extraction system, or renovations to improve accessibility.

Men's Sheds are an important part of our communities. They bring people together and improve the mental and physical health of members. People can work on common projects, form friendships and give back to those around them. There are approximately 360 Men's Sheds across Victoria. Each shed contributes a lot of value to their local community and the people who attend them.

Grant-writing resources are available on the Victorian government's How to write a grant application web page.

Applications for the Men's Shed Funding Program close at 5.00pm on 8 December 2023.

The lime tree at the Seawinds Community Hub got a new home thanks to the Rosebud and Districts Men's Shed crew.




